Board Stresses That Licensees Follow Minimum Standards

As you will notice, the newsletters published by the Board have placed strong emphasis on the Minimum Standards and enforcement matters. This is not intended to strike fear into the hearts of land surveyors but to try and educate those individuals who are practicing on the outer edge of the law and professionalism. The fact that a significant number of surveyors fall into this category is evident by the disciplinary actions listed herein and the number of complaints received (which average 6 to 8 per month).

Apparently some practitioners feel that unless or until they are reported they will ignore the standards. Consider a typical case:

1. You are investigated.
2. You do not contest the violation.
3. Probable cause is found and you choose an informal hearing before the Board. (Ten days after probable cause is found all information is public record.)
4. You are required to appear before the Board. (With very few exceptions, the Board insists on seeing the individual charged eyeball to eyeball.)
5. You are found guilty as charged.
6. Your penalty is a fine in the amount of the cost of the investigation and prosecution. You are placed

on probation for one year. Terms of probation require you to submit 5 surveys and supporting field notes to the Board every 3 months.

7. Your name, violation and penalty are published in this newsletter.
8. You violate probation. The Board has had one case of probation violation; that individual's license was revoked. We now have three probation violations pending. When a case reaches this point the Board has few options left. Think about it!

There are additional penalties for ignoring the standards, as the following situation (an actual case) shows. The Land Surveyor made a good survey of two interior lots in a subdivision, using interior control, without checking 270' to the corner. You guessed it, he was one 40' lot off. The error was detected after a house had been erected. Being a reputable surveyor, he rectified the situation at a cost of nearly \$7,000.

The Minimum Standards are written to protect the public; but, as you can see, they will protect the Land Surveyor as well if they are followed.

The vast majority of Land Surveyors do their very best to offer a truly professional service to the citizens of Florida and are a credit to the profession. I commend you. To the outer fringe . . . see you in Tallahassee.

**Questionnaire to Licensees Assists in
Licensing Exam Development**

The Task Analysis Questionnaire prepared by the Board of Professional Land Surveyors with the help of the Department's Examination Services and mailed to 600 of the Professional Land Surveyors was primarily for the purpose of obtaining data related directly to the everyday activities of the Florida Land Surveyor. From the results, which were computerized, it has been determined which activities have prime importance at the time of registration in the minds of those individuals who completed the questionnaire.

The data will help the Board and Department determine what revisions should be made to the present Board Rule that dictates the present examination content. This has already been discussed in a workshop in October and is being set for a public hearing in December for revisions to the existing Rule.

A total of 251 questionnaires were completed and returned. The method of distribution was to select approximately every third registrant in the Department's numerical listing. More recent registrants were chosen instead of older registrants, thereby hopefully not choosing retirees who have maintained their license.

For the 251 respondents, average years of experience were distributed as follows: Land Surveying, 20.1 years; in charge of Land Surveying work, 14.8 years; Land Surveying experience in Florida, 15.8 years; holding a Florida registration in Land Surveying, 8.9 years.

For this same group, education was distributed as follows: less than high school, 1.2%; high school graduate or equivalent, 45.8%; Associate Degree in Land Surveying, 6.9%; Associate Degree in other fields, 7.7%; Bachelor's Degree in Land Surveying, 3.6%; Bachelor's Degree in Engineering, 14.6%; Bachelor's Degree in other fields, 6.9%; Graduate Degree in other fields, 1.6%; Partial Degree, 11.7%.

As to the results of the questionnaire, the following tabulation illustrates all of the activities that were listed, the percentage of time spent on each activity (which was the average of the 251 respondents), the ranking by the percentage of time spent, and the ranking by the importance placed upon each activity as being a relevant item at the time of registration.

Law Changes on Inactive Licenses

Professional Land Surveyors who have allowed their licenses to become inactive are in danger of losing them entirely after only four years, rather than the formerly prescribed 10, according to a recent revision of F.S. 472.019, which went into effect October 1, 1983.

Formerly, licensed surveyors had 10 years to reactivate inactive licenses. Now, however, a license that has been inactive for more than four years will automatically expire. Once it expires, it becomes null and void without any further action by the State Board of Professional Land Surveyors or the Department of Professional Regulation.

Surveyors whose licenses have expired will need to apply for licensure under current standards and legal qualifications and may require retesting.

Licenses Who Do Not Renew Cannot Practice

Below is a list of licensees who have not renewed their Professional Land Surveyor's license. By law those licenses revert to inactive status; a Land Surveyor cannot practice on an inactive license.

Panel Reviews Thirty Cases

The results of Probable Cause Panel meetings, where it is determined whether or not charges against licensees are warranted, are as follows:

May 20, 1983—Fourteen cases were reviewed. In 4, case was closed/dismissed; in 7, probable cause was found; in 3, more information was requested.

June 24, 1983—Seven cases were reviewed. In 1, case was closed/dismissed; in 5, probable cause was found; in 1, more information was requested.

August 12, 1983—Nine cases were reviewed. In 4, probable cause was found; in 1, more information was requested; in 4, probable cause was not found (however, in 3 of these letters of guidance were sent).

Disciplinary Actions

The Board has taken disciplinary action concerning the following licensees. Although every effort is made to ensure that the information is correct, before making any specific decision based upon this information, you should check with the Board office to assure accuracy. The listing may not reflect a change occurring near or following the publication date. Further, the listing does not reflect pending appeals or requests for rehearings. Each order is listed as follows with the name, the address, the violation, and the action taken.

June 1982

Albert F. Tague, Jr. (LS 2579), Bradenton, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, incompetence in preparation of recorded plat. Fined \$1000, restitution of \$2000, quarterly reports to Board, and five year probation.

July 1982

Marlon Page (LS 961), Jacksonville, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and incompetence in preparation of survey. Reprimand and restitution of \$145.

August 27, 1982

Robert M. Gabloud (LS 2448), Winter Park, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); gross negligence, failed to disclose a 10' fence encroachment. Reprimand, fine of \$750, two year probation, and work reviewed every six months.

Richard Cayll (LS 1437), Satellite Beach, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, incompetency, signed and sealed documents not prepared under his supervision, direction or control. Reprimand and \$500 fine.

November 5, 1982

Ronald Kesselring (LS 2556), Apopka, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (a) (g) (h); negligence, failure to set or identify PRM's in accordance with Minimum Standards. Fined \$700, one year probation and review of work every six months.

John Majeka (LS 718), Daytona Beach, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and incompetency; did not show type of survey, angles or corners in accordance with Minimum Standards. Fined \$400, one year probation with review of work every six months.

January 1983

Albert F. Tague, Jr. (LS 2579), Bradenton, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (e) & (g); negligence and incompetency. Default, survey did not meet standards, gross errors on surveys. License revoked.

John B. Stewart (LS 2834), Boynton Beach, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and misconduct. Default, failed to complete survey. License revoked.

Arthur Molnar (LS 1186), Dunnellon, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and incompetency, failed to show pertinent information on survey. One year probation, review of work every six months and \$400 fine.

Marlon C. Gordon (LS 671), Sanford, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and incompetency, did not show pertinent information on survey. One year probation, review of work every three months and \$250 fine.

Robert Sapp (LS 1326), Gainesville, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, survey did not show pertinent information. Letter of reprimand.

Robert M. Gabloud (LS 2448), Orlando, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, failed to show pertinent information on survey. Letter of reprimand, \$250 fine.

Charles A. Buckner (LS 1083), Eau Gallie, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence. Stipulation agreed to whereby License suspended for 90 days.

William E. Powell (LS 1812), Melbourne, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence. No further action.

March 1983

Lester Bradley (LS 1380), Jacksonville, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and incompetency, survey failed to meet Minimum Standards. Fined \$250, placed on probation for 12 months with work being reviewed every three months.

Donald Craft (LS 1699), Bradenton, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and incompetency, survey did not meet Minimum Standards. Fined \$250, placed on probation for 12 months with work being reviewed every three months.

Glenn Thomas (LS 1605), Ocoee, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence and incompetency, surveys did not meet Minimum Standards. Fined \$250, placed on probation for 12 months with review of work every three months.

Tom Justice (LS 1005), Pensacola, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence for failing to use due care in performing in a land surveying capacity. Fined \$250, placed on probation for 12 months with review of work every six months, written reprimand.

June 1983

Lawrence Penny (LS 1472), Largo, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, affixing his seal and signature to a survey plat which he did not personally prepare. Fined \$1000 plus administrative costs of \$485, placed on probation for two years with review of five survey projects every three months.

Larry E. Miller (LS 1919), Green Cove Springs, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, no PRM's placed in ground. Fined administrative costs of \$872, placed on probation for one year with review of five survey projects (recorded plats) over past two years.

Paul H. Dukas (LS 2817), North Ft. Myers, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); misconduct as he did not fulfill contract. License suspended for one year effective August 15, 1983, unless Dukas appears before Board to show just cause.

Howard B. Kirkland (LS 2815), Naples, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (e); failed to file a report or record which was required. License suspended for one year effective August 15, 1983, unless he appears before Board to show just cause.

August 1983

Richard C. Hardy (LS 3135), Ft. Myers, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, used an incorrect PRM. Fined \$100, placed on one year probation with review of five surveys quarterly, and reprimand.

Donald A. Craft (LS 1699), Bradenton, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, erroneous description, failed to comply with Minimum Standards. Fined \$100, placed on probation for six months with review of five surveys quarterly.

Thomas Grusenmeyer (LS 1542), Orlando, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); negligence, monuments not set in accordance with Minimum Standards. Reprimand and \$100 fine.

Paul Dukas (LS 2817), North Ft. Myers, FL: Violation of Florida Statute 472.033 (1) (g); misconduct as he did not fulfill contract. License reinstated if payment to client is made in amount of \$1500.

The final product of the Task Analysis will assist the consultants who produce each examination. This data was the ranking of importance of the various knowledges that are required of the Land Surveyor to properly accomplish each activity. From this information the consultants can produce test questions that directly relate to the proper knowledges that need to be tested within each activity tested.

With the revised Rule, the examination in the Fall of 1984 will be based on the results of the Task Analysis and can be substantiated as being related to the everyday activities of the Florida Land Surveyor.

NOTE: Typographical Correction in Rule 21HH-6.03 (15). Open and notorious evidence of easements or rights of way on or across the lands surveyed shall be located or noted and shown upon the drawings. If location of easements or rights of way of record, other than those on record plats, is required, this information *must* be furnished to the land surveyor.
